Updates from SILS Phase 4 Groups

Resource Management Functional Group (Liz)

We have 4 data migration decisions to finalize before October 30. Collecting feedback from various groups. UCLA and UCSD have also started testing local authorities in the NZ and IZs. We will be looking at the NZ load order in early November.

Acquisitions & E-Resource Functional Group (Sarah Sheets)

Mostly focused on tests and surfacing issues. Working with RMFG on recommendations for Test.

ILS Data Cleanup Group (TJ)

The group is learning Alma together and preparing to write concise and operational recommendations based on decisions made by Resource Management Functional Group.

SCP SILS Phase 4 Update (Shi)

- ExLibris provided a session on SCP workflow on Oct 1, and also follow-up workflows on Oct. 16
- SCP staff has been busy testing out SCP workflow to bring SCP records from CDL IZ into UCS NZ
 - Challenge to find a good match point to bring SCP records into NZ, by OCLC#, ISSN/ISBN,
 - Made a good progress to copy NZ MMSID of CZ bib to matched CDL IZ records, the drawback is to create duplicated OCLC records
 - Will contact ExLibris to learn about workflow of batch cleaning up duplicate OCLC records

SCP Updates (Shi, Becky)

- **Serials Phase II:** Making progress, about 1300 records remain (600 Chinese, 700 non-Chinese which Becky has the number down to 400 as of Monday)
- JSTOR DDA: new workflow was discussed among cataloger (Donal), members of UC eBook Strategic Team, and JSTOR, is setting up and running, new titles will be reconciled with Project Muse title list and have JSTOR turn on the access to non-PM titles. PM titles may still show up after reconciliation.
- Dacheng brief records: reconciliation of overlap with Chinese periodicals is almost finished, once it is done, non-matched titles will be sent via OCLC data sync service to add to OCLC, estimated 2,000 records to OCLC data sync, and 2500~3000 overlap with Chinese periodicals
- Becky coordinated and received volunteers to finish the missing CONSER CCM modules. We are aiming to finish in mid January-February
- Becky also has been working on OECD for 2019. This includes serials, books with series. The latter are cataloged both as monographs and serials. We are cataloging them this way because all the monographs that have series are found under the heading for the serial. Every resource has an ISBN whether or not it is a book, a serial analytic, or a serial volume.
 - Question to members: Becky learned from a campus librarian that CZ's OECD was 2 years behind and wanted verified. She is cataloging the database resources as one collection
 - UCD: OECD has 13 collections, some collection didn't get update since 2018, try to ask ExL to work with vendor to provide update; if CZ collection coded differently, for example, code database, but actually selective package, has to create local collection; review each package, if CZ collection records only have three lines, will have to do something for cataloging; also comparing local collections with CZ collections for preparation of migration due to POL, etc. complicated problem.
 - UCSB: ebook from CZ, acq. & catalogers are not happy with it and just bring OCLC records over. Also proxy issue since migrated in 2017, ended use UCSB's own collection; also look for workflow if need to change
