### E-dissertations

- All Campus Groups meeting with SOPAG considered setting up a task force.
- CAMCIG is polling campuses on cataloging of dissertations and linking to digital.

# Local bib data in the WorldCat pilot

- Report covers the "waterfront."
- No local-holdings records in initial pilot.
- CAMCIG discussing how to code local information so that it stays in the OCLC master record. CAMCIG discussing e-dissertations.
- Report identified URLs as the most important local information.
- Writers of the report have done a "good job."

### **Mass digitization report**

- Each campus will decide what to do (if anything) with the records.
- Automatically adding the links to local print records may not be possible.
- If records not added to local OPAC, then the only access is through WorldCat local.
- UCSD has begun discussions on the public and technical services implications of digitization.
- All campuses will be visited by implementation team.
- UCLA has been discussing the implications of retaining in the local OPAC only records representing what circulates or is paid for locally. Would this effect collection statistics?
- University of Washington estimates that 500,000 of their resources are not represented in WorldCat Local.
- What would be the implications to ERMSystems if some e-resources in OCLC and not in local OPAC?
- Timelines and considerations for reclamation projects discussed.

ACTION: John Riemer sent out link to guidelines for pursuing reclamation projects. ACTION: Lee Leighton will send out UCB reclamation planning document.

### **Bindery report / Carole Kiehl**

- Final report sent to ULs.
- Group held conference calls and one in-person meeting and visit to bindery.

- Group identified areas for saving money; total savings conservatively estimated at less than 5% of total costs.
- Focus of report is on standardization (e.g, NISO); standardization is good.
- Implementation of recommendations should be easy.
- Frequent shipments are no problem for Bindery; fewer shipments could be a problem for some campuses.
- Report is solid if not exciting.

# **Single/multiple records for e-resources**

• OCLC holdings symbols for SCP may lessen the problems caused by single records for print/electronic serials.
