
Comments from Survey:


- Damage to library, regardless of policy patrons sneak in food/drink
- Complaints from other patrons about food smells
- Enforced by staff and/or security
- Enforced by few, casually by others
- Additional custodial services required during finals week
- Inadequate recycle bins plastic containers tossed into trash





 - Most enforce policy if patrons complain



• A graduate student tried to have an impromptu cello concert in the lobby. She was asked to stop.



How many UC's Have Locked Rooms for Patron Use?




By which a Key is always checked out, in lieu of Access Services locking/unlocking the room(s).


Comments from Survey:

- Several UC's have unlocked study rooms for patron use – first come, first served.
 - Locked rooms available by reservation only
 - Removed locks from study rooms –
 now no hankie-pankie
 - •Several UC's have faculty and/or graduate carrels that are locked spaces

Have any areas been changed from their original intent?



Did these changes affect Access Services?



Examples of what these Areas were changed to:

- UCB (Bus & Econ) space taken from main service area & used for special groups of students related to the department
- UCD (Health Sci) Closure/redistribution of HSTS allowed move of all Access staff into a single work space; Unbounds relocated creating open study space.
- UCD (Shields) ILL closed and combined with Circulation Desk

Examples of what these Areas were changed to:

- UCI More staff offices; In midst of major reconfiguration of main floors which will impact services
- UCLA "Pod" spaces installed on two floors
- UCM Study rooms converted to classrooms, computer labs and meeting rooms
- UCR Added more bookable study rooms; new leisure reading area; combined Circulation & Reserve Desks in Rivera Library
- UCSB more individual and group study rooms, which require more key check out.

Examples of what these Areas were changed to:

- UCSC Some public spaces now for staff use; some staff spaces will be study rooms after renovation is complete
- UCSD (CLICS) A group study room converted into a presentation room.
- UCSD (Geisel) Faculty carrels repurposed to general study rooms; Reference collections weeded to make additional study/reading room space.

Summary of what these Areas where changed to:

• Biggest trend is to reallocate areas of the library to create or add study rooms, meeting rooms, computer labs, and open study space for students.

 Next largest trend is to relocate or consolidate staff areas.



Are Noise / Food & Drink Policies More Permissive?



Are more permissive policies for Food & Drink effective?

- •Same amount of trash?
- •Less or more spills?
- •Patrons aren't "hiding" food, "no fault" policy.
- More inviting atmosphere more relaxed, no need to leave to eat, vending machines available.
- •Higher gate counts more students wanting to study in the library.
- •Have any costs increased because of new policy?

 Tone and scope of documents vary widely.

Scope of Policies

- Physical Collection
 - Be nice to our materials

- Physical Building and Equipment
 - Be nice to our space

- User Environment
 - Be nice to each other

Approaches

- Legalistic
 - List of prohibited behaviors
- Humanistic
 - Rights and Responsibilities

Legalistic

- Detailed list of prohibited behaviors
 - UCSD leads the pack with 19
 - Berkeley has 17
 - San Francisco has 15
 - Is unique in that almost all reference California law or UC Policy

Humanistic

Right

• "You have the right to a Library environment that is clean."

Responsibility

• "You have the responsibility to put your trash where it belongs and to notify Library staff of spills, trash, and vandalism."

Repercussions

- Asked to leave premises
- Being reported to police
- Legal prosecution
- Refuse/Revoke access
