I. Enhancing Search and Retrieval

I.1 Provide users with direct access to item

I.1b: Provide an "I-want-this" button that is present when the context warrants, with the goal of always offering a fulfillment option. No dead ends.

II. Rearchitecting the OPAC

II.1 Create a single catalog interface for all of UC

II.1a: Create a single catalog interface for both local and system wide collections.

NISO Circulation Interchange Protocol (Z39.83-2002)

 This standard will define the various transactions needed to support circulation activities among independent library systems. Circulation activities include patron and item inquiry and update transactions, such as hold or reserve, check-out, renew, and check-in. UC CDL Request (and DDS)

- CDL Request utilizes ...
 - Authentication (user validation)
 - Authorization (user privileges)
- Users authenticated in local system (active account, no blocks, no expiry)
- Users authorized in CDL Request "fulfillment service" (ex: user eligible for campus DDS)

UC-WCL Principles


- Do No Harm (preserve services!)
 - CDL Request
 - UC-eLinks
 - Campus DDS
- Expand services to include Circ Transactions
 - Holds & recalls (but for local stuff only!)
- User authentication on UC side only!
 - But....NCIP not yet implemented by UC's ILSs!






Place Hold Button Presented




Over The Wall



User Selects Pick Up Loc




Local OPAC Item Record Displays




User clicks the "Request" button

WCL Institution Registry & PlaceHold

- WCL Registry does not know if user is authorized to take intended action in the local OPAC
- Some users may be dropped "Over the Wall" and learn that their intended action cannot be done
- Institution Registry for PlaceHolds dependent on:
 - Successfully finding the local record
 - Retrieving the item's availability
 - Configuration of Status Message Table for campus
 - Configuration of Library Policies Table for campus

Next-Generation Melvyl Timeline

Pilot begins in April 2008 and lasts at least six months

During the pilot, staff will conduct formal usability testing gathering input from UC students, faculty, staff, and other users to determine how well the system meets their needs

In fall, a more fully developed Request system will be in place—fewer clicks for users to get to the item

Following the completion of the pilot, a decision will be made about whether to move forward or to pursue other options
