Special Committee on Scholarly Communications

Ober reviewed the status of the white papers and copyright proposal and described next steps will be taken by the Academic Council and UCOL.

Rapid Response (how can SCO position itself to respond quickly on scholarly communication issues?)

- 1) Examples, such as PubChem, ACS new pricing, and Cornyn/Lieberman proposed Act, illustrate the need for SCO to be ready with responses on behalf of the libraries.
- 2) SCO rapid response focus relates to raising awareness and engagement with the UC community, especially faculty, while the CDC/JSC rapid response focus relates to responses necessary to advance or protect collections and collection strategies.
- 3) "toolkit" for proposed Cornyn/Lierberman Act based on Ober's email summary document will be developed by Ober with

- assistance from Barclay, and Starr for review at next SCO conference call or earlier if needed.
- 4) "communications" plan will be developed by Tanji, Ober, Yokote for review at next SCO conference call.
