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Executive Summary

The Power of Three 1 (POT1) Lightning Team 3A (LT3A) was charged with identifying/analyzing existing digital collections in the UC Libraries for inclusion in the UC Libraries Digital Collection (UCLDC) that would include the following:

- Develop guidelines for collections to be included (addressing file types, rights
 management, and other issues) and a way to publicize resulting decisions. Guidelines
 should cover both the hosting and surfacing aspects and can be developed as two
 separate sets of guidelines that mutually inform each other.
- Identify existing UC Libraries digital collections with potential for inclusion in the UCLDC including both collections in need of a hosting solution and those ready to be harvested for discovery/display. (use DLSTF 1 Appendix 3A as a starting point, but identify other sources and mechanisms for reaching out beyond the usual respondents).
- Identify mechanisms for continual discovery of additional materials, as well as mechanisms for promoting the availability of UCLDC across the campuses.

LT3A identified approximately 750 digital collections stewarded by the UC Libraries, expanded from the previous digital projects inventory created by the Digital Library Services Task Force in 2009. As was its predecessor the newly compiled inventory is neither comprehensive nor complete in the data collected, as it was used simply as a tool in the overall process. In order to fully understand the scope of collections, accurately represent campus needs with respect to the UCLDC, and further refine this inventory LT3A conducted a series of telephone interviews with representatives from each of the ten campuses

An analysis of collections was performed thereafter to understand the similarities/commonalities among digital collections, especially those that that will impact the development of the UCLDC. A number of themes emerged across the system, namely:

- Varying need for a DAMS and discovery/display interface
- Use of common and/or similar hosting platforms
- Possession of one-off and patron-driven digital objects
- Common digital object types and subject areas
- Lack of ownership of physical materials
- Need for varying levels of access restrictions
- Specialized support for some material

In response to these findings, LT3A developed a set of criteria and guidelines used to select collections for initial inclusion in the UCLDC. LT3A took a holistic approach, trying whenever possible to strike a balance between addressing campus needs and strengthening the systemwide digital collection. The team made sure to include collections of "low hanging fruit" that will enable UCLDC development to move forward quickly, yet also selected collections that present a challenge and certain degree of complexity that the system will need to accommodate. LT3A also took into consideration the following factors for each digital collection: digital object type, file format type, metadata, access restrictions, and level of support.

Using the developed criteria and guidelines, LT3A analyzed the existing digital collections and identified sixty-four collections across the UC system that we believe would provide a solid start for the UCLDC. Please refer to the "Recommendations for Initial Content" section of this report for a complete listing of identified collections.

The continual discovery of additional material throughout the UC Libraries as well as the promotion of the UCLDC to end users must also be considered. In both cases, the recommendations of LT3A encompass communication, organization, and system-based elements. A regular stream of new content will be an important criterion in ensuring the success of the system and the UCLDC will need to develop a wide range of services which will help to identify and incentivize ongoing contributions of new content. The process for nominating and contributing digital content should be relatively simple, minimizing the need for extensive technical skills and staff resources. For the promotion aspect, an important outreach goal will be to raise the visibility of the UCLDC and its utility as a research destination. Equally important will be the ability to put digital collections in the path of the user. LT3A strongly believes that promotion alone will not be sufficient to drive awareness of and interest in the UCLDC. Rather, the design of the platform itself must meet user needs and expectations.

In closing, LT3A understands the need to communicate the information presented in this report to a variety of campus constituents. It is essential that each campus understands the processes behind LT3A's selections of initial content for the UCLDC as this will help build relationships and foster collaboration at the systemwide level. LT3A recommends that the results of this report are disseminated to key stakeholders throughout the UC Libraries as deemed appropriate by the Systemwide Operations and Planning Advisory Group (SOPAG). Methods for dissemination may include, but limited to e-mail, listserv announcements, and blog posts.

Identification and Analysis of Existing UC Digital Collections

The work of LT3A began with the identification of digital collections maintained by the UC Libraries. This was followed by an analysis of the collections to understand the similarities and/or commonalities among them.

Methodology

LT3A undertook the following methodology to identify, gather information about, and analyze existing digital collections maintained by the UC Libraries:

- Reviewed "Appendix 3A: Current and Planned Digital Initiatives Inventory" found in the Digital Library Services Task Force (DLSTF) final report from 2009.¹
- Identified new categories of interest regarding existing digital collections based on the scope of Next Generation Technical Services (NGTS) POT1 and added these to the digital initiatives inventory.
- 3. Identified representatives on each campus to comment on the revised inventory and to review/update it as needed.²
- 4. Established an initial set of criteria/guidelines and scripted interview questions to facilitate conversations with campus representatives.
- 5. Held telephone conversations with campus representatives to discuss their updated digital initiatives inventories and answer a set of related questions devised by LT3A.
- Analyzed the updated digital initiatives inventories and revised the criteria/guidelines for initial content in response to the information presented to LT3A by each campus.

Identification of Collections

As a result of the work described above, LT3A compiled a new inventory of more than 750 existing digital collections that are maintained by the UC Libraries. This inventory, although not exhaustive in its scope, nor consistent in the level of information gathered, provided LT3A with enough data to perform an in-depth analysis to identify similarities and/or commonalities among digital collections currently maintained by the UC Libraries.

LT3A further refined this inventory to expose collections in need of a DAMS solution and/or ready for surfacing in a discovery/display interface. This information is presented in the appendices of this report.

Specific recommendations for collections ready for immediate inclusion in the UCLDC are presented in the "Recommendations for Initial Content" section of this report.

Analysis of Collections

A number of themes emerged as LT3A reviewed the digital initiatives inventory and explored the existing digital collections within the UC Libraries.

1. Varying Need for a DAMS and Discovery/Display Interface

Some campus libraries have implemented local solutions for a DAMS and discovery/display interface. The degree to which each current system meets the needs of the campus varies. While some campuses are content with the systems that they have in place, others are simply "making due" and eager to explore potential alternatives that are developed for the UCLDC. Still other campuses may choose to selectively use a systemwide solution when it is available, since they already have specialized systems in place that are tailored to their content and/or workflows.

Please note that most campuses also expressed interest in a central preservation system, especially if it provides more robust treatment than some campuses are currently providing locally. Since the DAMS solution employed by the UCLDC is expected to provide preservation services, this may be another incentive for participation even for those campuses with local DAMS solutions already in place.

2. Common and/or Similar Hosting Platforms

There are a number of collections across the system that are currently hosted in common and/or similar environments, whether maintained locally or externally. The following platforms repeatedly surfaced over the course of LT3A's analysis as places where multiple contributors are storing and/or displaying content:

- Online Archive of California (OAC)/Calisphere
- Omeka
- CONTENTdm
- ARTstor (either through the UC Shared Images program or independently)
- The Internet Archive
- Web Archiving Service (WAS)
- Merritt
- eScholarship

These common platforms may provide significant return on investment, if a single workflow can be developed for each platform to return many collections across campuses; or if it could be extensible to other collections using the same software or in similar local environments.

3. One Off (and Patron-Driven) Digital Objects

Campus libraries reported that their digital holdings include "one-off" digital objects that are not always maintained in the context of an overarching collection. Such objects are typically created in response to a patron request. There is an interest amongst the campuses to utilize a DAMS to host, manage, preserve, and provide access to this type of digital content.

4. Common Digital Object Types

Images were found to be the most common digital object type including both simple (one image per object) and complex (more than one image per object) objects. Audiovisual and textual material was also found to be quite prevalent and in many cases this type of material was under supported by current DAMS solutions and discovery/display interfaces. Compound object types, which include multiple types of formats per object (e.g., an oral history with audio and text files), are also present on the campuses and should be considered in the development of the UCLDC.

5. Common Subject Areas

While campuses collect and subsequently digitize in unique areas relevant to their respective constituencies, several common subjects emerged from the total picture of collections. LT3A notes the particular prevalence of the following subjects:

- California history includes material that documents the individuals, communities, cities, and counties throughout the state. Material on the development of California agriculture, industry, and infrastructure are also included.
- UC history includes material, often from University Archives, of enduring historical value to the UC sytem. Includes items that document campus events, student life, construction of buildings, and prominent faculty members.
- Cultural diversity includes material related to the cultures, nationalities, and ethnicities that are particularly prominent in California such as the Asian and Latino communities.

LT3A notes that many of these collections may have been digitized as part of systemwide efforts or grant funded projects such as California Cultures, the Japanese American Relocation Digital Archive, and the Local History Digital Resources Project. However, it appears that there are also many existing collections within this scope that were not part of those collaborative digitization initiatives.

6. Ownership of Physical Materials

Campus libraries indicated that they provide online access to at least one digital collection for which they do not own the physical material. Some specific examples include the following:

- UCSF hosts and maintains the Legacy Tobacco Documents Library, which offers
 integrated access to disparate documents held by several corporations. The
 collection only exists in digital format.
- UCM has digitized several objects and collections on behalf of non-UC institutions and individuals in the community, for example the Henry O. Nightingale diary.
- UCB maintains the Digital Scriptorium, a growing image database of medieval and renaissance manuscripts, held at UC Berkeley as well as about 30 other major universities and institutions.
- UCD participated in a collaborative project to digitize, encode, and provide integrated access to more than 100 California United Farm Workers contracts held in a faculty member's personal collection.

This finding illustrates the fact that a campus library's stewardship of a digital object does not necessarily correlate with its ownership of the corresponding physical object. Consequently, it could play a role in how the UCLDC is defined conceptually and may affect its usability and service requirements. For example, perhaps there should be the expectation that contributing campus should be able to address (or redirect) reference inquiries about all digital content it stewards in the UCLDC.

7. Access Restrictions

While many collections are publicly accessible, campus libraries also maintain collections with various levels of access restrictions, described as follows:

- UC-only
- Campus-only
- Department-only
- IP address restrictions
- On-demand access
- Authentication/logon access

8. Specialized Support for Select Material

Several of the campus libraries indicated a need for specialized support that addresses specific types of collections within their holdings. Some common themes that emerged in this area are as follows:

- Support for map and aerial photograph collections, including a metadata schema that will allow for geographic searching.
- Support for scientific data sets.
- Support for oral histories.
- Support for web archiving video and social media content (CDL's Web Archiving Service currently does not provide such support).
- Support for digitized newspapers that can handle the METS ALTO standard (similar to support provided by products such as Veridian Digital Library Software).

Criteria and Guidelines for Initial Content

Based on the identification and analysis of existing digital collections, LT3A devised a set of criteria and guidelines used to select collections for initial inclusion in the UCLDC.

Approach

LT3A took a holistic approach to the selection process to ensure that the group of collections chosen was fair, addressed campus needs, and could realistically be utilized in the initial phase of the UCLDC project. Specifically, LT3A tried to balance the following considerations as selections were made:

1. Collection Themes

Selection of unique collections on different themes showcasing the diversity of campus collections

balanced with

Selection of similar collections on common themes that draw out systemwide strengths otherwise unseen

2. Collection Value and Interest

balanced with

Selection of collections that demonstrate clear teaching and research value (such collections include those that have interest across a wide range of academic disciplines, reflect an institution's particular collecting strengths, and/or highlight prominent research and history)

Selection of collections with broad public interest, as it will be important that the launch of the UCLDC generates interest amongst a wide range of users

3. Whole-to-Part Relationship

Selection of collections indicated by the campuses as having regional, local, or campus importance as well as those of high research value or public interest

balanced with

Selection of collections that benefit the UC system and UCLDC in its initial development and launch

4. Degree of Challenge

Selection of "low hanging fruit" that is immediately available for inclusion in the UCLDC balanced with

Selection of material that presents a certain degree of challenge and complexity that will serve as a useful test case for the development of the UCLDC

Initial Criteria and Guidelines

Coupled with the broad considerations listed above, LT3A also employed the use of more granular criteria/guidelines. It is noted below when differences in criteria/guidelines exist between those collections that are ready for ingest into a DAMS and those ready for surfacing.

1. Digital Object Types

DAMS and Surfacing: The UCLDC is expected to accommodate a variety of digital object types. However, depending on the DAMS solution and discovery/display interface that is developed, some object types may be more easily ingested, harvested, and/or displayed than others when the UCLDC is first established. To enable immediate ingest and access, LT3A has recommended many collections that contain simple objects. To provide useful test cases for development a selection of collections with compound objects, such as objects with both audiovisual and textual files has also been recommended.

2. File Format Types

DAMS and Surfacing: LT3A has recommended collections that appear to have been digitized using universally accepted format types of sufficient quality for public access and that do not appear to be in immediate need of migration or reformatting.

3. Metadata

DAMS and Surfacing: LT3A has recommended collections which have enough descriptive metadata (either at the collection or item level) to support, at minimum, keyword searching across all metadata or selected fields. We have also recommended collections that sufficiently document copyright, or at least provide the user with enough information to find out more about an item if further action is needed.

4. Access Restrictions

DAMS: Although the UCLDC will eventually accommodate content at a variety of access levels, LT3A has recommended that collections with public content should be given priority status at the project's launch. This means, at minimum, that initial collections have universal access to metadata and some representative content (e.g., thumbnails). Where content may not be fully available (e.g., thumbnails instead of full images), other factors have argued for inclusion (e.g., importance of content and value of metadata in lieu of content).

Surfacing only: LT3A has recommended collections for initial surfacing only if they are unrestricted and publicly accessible.

5. Level of Support

DAMS: LT3A has recommended collections for immediate inclusion that are unsupported or are in under-supported environments. These collections often times exist only on local hard drives or networks and would benefit from the management afforded by a DAMS. Many additional collections were described as in need of a better DAMS solution than currently employed, and LT3A recommends that these are considered for the next round of inclusion.

Surfacing only: LT3A has recommended collections that are hosted and available online and appear well enough supported to ensure persistent access to the material. Several collections that are ready for surfacing would also benefit from a more robust DAMS solution. However, as described above, LT3A recommends that these are considered for the next round of inclusion as the UCLDC could at least support their discovery initially.

Future Criteria and Guidelines

The criteria and guidelines developed by LT3A may also be a useful starting point for identifying existing and even potentially new collections for the UCLDC once it is operational, although they may need to be adapted to reflect the capabilities of the system(s) in place.

Additionally, LT3A points out that the CDL has developed two useful documents that could form the basis for future criteria/guidelines:

1. CDL Guidelines for Digital Objects⁴

LT3A discovered that a majority of the campuses are currently making use of these guidelines. In particular, the descriptive metadata guidelines specifying minimum level metadata (identifier, title, creator, date, type, and institution) that could serve as very broad, non-prescriptive requirements for the UCLDC. Additional descriptive metadata to support public discovery and rights management metadata that sufficiently documents copyright (utilizing PREMIS or METSRights) is also highly desirable.

2. CDL Digital File Format Recommendations: Master Production Files⁵

Most campuses are aware of these recommendations, and several have used them for various collections. However, LT3A notes that legacy collections do not always adhere to the recommendations, and migration is rarely seen as a feasible solution in these cases. As more existing collections are picked up and surfaced in the UCLDC, they may be assessed for their

quality (e.g., resolution for images, and sampling size and frequency for audio); it may be determined that some legacy collections are not at sufficient quality for surfacing through the UCLDC and would need to be migrated.

Recommendations for Initial Content

Using the developed criteria and guidelines, LT3A analyzed the existing digital collections and has identified sixty-four collections across the UC system that we believe would provide a solid start for the UCLDC. It is envisioned that the UCLDC will both host content in a DAMS and surface content that is hosted in other systems. As such LT3A has compiled two lists: collections well suited for initial ingest into a DAMS and collections ready for immediate surfacing through a discovery/display interface.

LT3A ensured that every campus was represented on the surfacing component. Since some campuses indicated no need for a systemwide DAMS at this time, not all campuses are represented on the DAMS list.

Please note that the following lists do not represent all of the collections in need of a systemwide DAMS and/or surfacing in a display/discovery interface. A more comprehensive list (that includes additional information) of these collections can be found in the appendices of this report.

DAMS: Initial collections for UCLDC

LT3A recommends that the following twenty digital collections be considered for immediate inclusion in the DAMS component of the UCLDC. Additional collections that should be considered for future inclusion can be found in Appendix A.

Continual Discovery of Content

A regular stream of new content will be an important criterion in ensuring the success of the UCLDC. To promote regular and ongoing campus contributions, the UCLDC will need to clearly articulate the benefits of participation in the centralized system. Furthermore, the process for nominating and contributing digital content should be relatively simple, minimizing the need for extensive technical skills and staff resources. The varieties of systems, resources, and workflows that have been developed at the local campuses have resulted in a diverse set of needs that should be considered during the planning and development of both the DAMS and the discovery/display interface. The UCLDC will need to develop a wide range of services, both in terms of organizational structure and system functionality, which will help to identify and incentivize ongoing contributions of new content.

Organizational Structure

- 1. Assign a current (e.g., CDC) or establish a new systemwide group to provide periodic reports about the types of content that is being digitized and/or acquired as born-digital. This group could also provide direction as to priorities for digitization at the systemwide level.
- Utilize a listserv to provide regular updates to current/potential contributors and stakeholders describing new digital collections, system developments, and grant opportunities.
- 3. Appoint UCLDC representatives at each campus that can promote information sharing within/between campuses and reach out to potential contributors.
- 4. Create documentation and/or webinars describing the UCLDC that is targeted at content contributors both inside and, eventually, outside of the library.

System functionality

- Harvest content and/or metadata for the UCLDC from local campus systems on a regular basis (requiring ingest of content into an effectively redundant system is seen as a potential barrier to participation).
- Develop processes that allow for the simple transfer of content and/or metadata to the UCLDC from CDL hosted services (e.g., Merritt, OAC/Calisphere) and other Third Party applications (e.g., CONTENTdm, Omeka).
- Set up a collection registry for campuses to describe new, in-process, and ongoing digital
 collections so that there is greater awareness at the systemwide level of the work being
 conducted at each campus.
- 4. Support common library services (e.g., usage/reproduction requests, collection of usage fees, general patron feedback) as well as Web 2.0 functionality (e.g., user generated metadata).
- 5. Provide tools for campuses to connect collections held by different repositories that allow for the sharing and repurposing of metadata. More specifically a system with the ability to create,

- maintain, and share personal/corporate names, geographic names, and subject headings across UCLDC collections.
- 6. Provide UC campuses with a range of options to meet local needs and integrate collections and services into the local context from centralized branding and/or filtering by campus, through providing thematic cross-campus subsets, to APIs connecting to local or third party applications.

Promotion to End Users

Promotion of the UCLDC to end users will need to take place at several levels. While an important outreach goal will be to raise the visibility of the UCLDC and its utility as a research destination, equally important will be the ability to put digital collections in the path of the user. LT3A strongly believes that promotion alone will not be sufficient to drive awareness of and interest in the UCLDC. Rather, the design of the platform itself must meet user needs and expectations.

Mechanisms for Promotion

- 1. Create an appealing landing page as part of the UCLDC interface that demonstrates the range of content in the repository and highlights marquee and/or newly added collections.
- 2. Create a Splash/FAQ page as part of the UCLDC interface that contains a clear description of the service, its benefits of use, and other pertinent information.
- Develop a full Search Engine Optimization strategy (e.g. assigning unique descriptive URLs, ensuring all content can be arrived at from every page). Ideally, this should be considered during the development of the system requirements.
- Utilize social media platforms such as Facebook, Twitter, and/or a Blogs to publicize and generate interest in new content.
- 5. Build partnerships with other digital object and/or metadata repositories (e.g., Internet Archive, OCLC, OAC/Calisphere).
- 6. Enable RSS feeds that track the addition of new content and are configurable by contributors.
- Develop teaching materials and workshops that can be offered to researchers promoting the UCLDC and demonstrating how it can be effectively used.
- 8. Provide tools that allow users to bookmark/save objects, provide feedback (direct to holding repository), requests reproductions, and schedule visits.

Communicating Resulting Decisions

LT3A recommends that the results of this report are disseminated to various channels throughout the UC Libraries as deemed appropriate by the Systemwide Operations and Planning Advisory Group (SOPAG).

LT3A views the following entities as key stakeholders and all should be included on any distributed communication:

- Council of University Librarians (CoUL)
- Collection Development Committee (CDC)
- Heads of Special Collections (HOSC)
- Heads of Public Services (HOPS)
- UC Archivists Council (UCAC)

Methods for communicating results can include:

- Direct e-mail to the campus representatives who provided information and participated in telephone interviews
- E-mail to appropriate UC Libraries' listservs
- Next Generation Technical Services (NGTS) blog
- Splash/FAQ page on any forthcoming UCLDC websites
