15 min	Alison Scott	SCLG update SCLG's focus continues to be divided between the Elsevier negotiation and communication efforts, alternative access, offsetting agreements, and the review of tier 1 resources. SCLG's review of tier 1 resources will continue in 19/20, and the basis for identifying potential candidates to consider for cancellation or reclassification (to tiers 2 or 3) will remain the same. SCLG has started preparing to assess the numerous large packages that are up for renewal next year.

		Decision: For recommendation four, DOC endorses the proposal that it commit itself to consider including linked data experience/representation on future systemwide initiatives, as appropriate (for groups/projects that DOC oversees or proposes candidates for).	
		Several DOC members reflected that while they support charging an action group to pursue a linked data project, they must acknowledge that their campus likely can't commit staff to such a project given the other systemwide technical work that's happening right now (including SILS, Project Surfliner, etc.)	
		Decision: DOC's response to recommendation two will note that several DOC members are concerned about whether this action is indeed actionable (re: staffing concerns).
