(Will share notes to include) As we move through this harmonization work as a system, it will be important to have a culture of humility and relinquishment and collaboration from top to bottom. One of the goals of this group will be to help campuses define and prioritize local needs in relation to system needs so that the data and processes are compatible. These conversations may need to happen on the campus level as well as system level. The people who care about these changes may be faculty or other stakeholders rather than staff.

Scott	Useful background docs: Project Transform Group Rosters Pathways to OA: Executive Summary and Chart (Feb 2018) Choosing Pathways to	Background In 2016 an international conference on OA in Berlin issued an expression of interest which institutions could sign to commit to accelerating the change towards OA through transforming subscription agreements with publishers to publisher agreements. Many institutions across Europe signed, but no US institutions joined. In Winter 2016 CoUL began developing an OA roadmap that could work for US institutions. In 2018 they published the Pathways to OA document, a strategic plan on how to accelerate the transition to OA. It took a "big tent" approach to OA, incorporating a variety of different strategies based on needs. Around the same time the UC Academic Senate published their Statement of Rights and Principles, which stated their goals for moving towards OA. Both plans were combined to create a call to action that was released in June 2018. The plan focused on journal negotiations, charging us to change negotiations with existing publishers to include 100% OA for UC authored articles

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				Open Access (CP20A Forum) (April 2019)	at a net cost savings for the UC. This began with a pilot year of negotiations with 7-8 publishers with a goal of 3-4 agreements. In June 2019 CoUL established Project Transform (PT), which would continue the work begun in the pilot for a period of 2 years, at which point it would be reevaluated. PT is intended to be a finite project during the transition to OA. PT works with the support of the Academic Senate. SCLG receives an update from PT at all of their meetings. PT negotiates and makes a recommendation to CoUL. The recommendation is simultaneously vetted by SCLG, which makes its own recommendation to CoUL. Projects outside of the scope of transition to OA continue to be managed by SCLG. Once an agreement has been reached to move a publisher to OA, SCLG takes over management of that contract. The SCLG STAR team remains an independent group that focuses on born OA resources.
