- Continuing discussion on UC ...er OCLC symbols and maintaining holdings for e-resources (from July meeting)
 - Resource Management feedback to SCP-AC regarding SCP holdings:
As a system, we rely on WorldCat Daily updates to keep our catalog up to date with changes to bibliographic description, and most importantly to access points, like name authority headings and subject headings. In this time of constant changes to our controlled vocabularies, it is

essential that we have the most up-to-date versions of these records. Additionally, with the impending transition to a linked data environment, this need will be even more essential.

<https://uc-sils.atlassian.net/wiki/spaces/RMF/pages/1564606587/Go-live+and+beyond+WorldCat+Daily+Updates>, following SCP cleanup of the migration, further testing and decisions regarding inclusion of CDL holdings symbols in the WorldCat Daily Updates was expected to take place. Resource Management has expected that these would be incorporated at some point, whether as SCP-ER holdings or campus-ER holdings. This would affect roughly a half million records currently. The Resource Management Subgroup recommends that this planned work be completed prior to making a determination about discontinuing maintaining of campus ER holdings by SCP.

- Marcus checking how many records aren't getting WorldShare updates: 192k of 506k NZ records have not received OCLC daily updates, but this count could also include campus records that are just static.
- Catherine checking if local e-resource records are part of WorldShare updates
- Marcus clarifying that -er holdings would not be removed. They would just not be maintained, and remain static.
- Would technically include ETDs, but the publishing profile goes through a different workflow.
- Important consideration for OA - if campuses cataloging locally, then send to SCP for NZ management, if local holdings are deleted, then they wouldn't get daily updates in the future.
- SCP-AC recommendation - allow SCP to stop managing -er holdings in OCLC. RM can separately work on updating specs for OCLC daily updates to include records with -er holdings symbols.
- Need to communicate to campuses that this is happening, and to be aware. Marcus can add it to the SCP Update
 - Blurb for SCP Update
 - Following discussions during the SCP advisory committee and the committee's recommendation, SCP will suspend maintaining the UC -er OCLC holdings.
- The vast majority (74%) of shared electronic resources are managed through the Ex Libris Alma Community Zone (CZ). CZ bibliographic records either lack OCLC numbers, have multiple OCLC numbers or have incorrect OCLC numbers (for example, the print OCLC number). Only 26% of NZ e-resources are from WorldCat (with OCLC numbers). With budget cuts and subscription cancellations, maintaining e-resource holdings in OCLC is increasing SCP workload.
